
Anne Østgaard and Egil Nyhus have made a collection of fun, cool counting poems for tough kids – and most other kids too!

The Castle is a novel about injustice, friendship and the stirrings of emotion between boy and girl.

Sigbjørn Mostue **TARN OF DEATH**

Mathias and his sister Malin are taken on an overnight trip to a nature reserve by their eager, nature-loving father. But their father's new girlfriend Ella Loudmouth and her daughter Birgitte are also coming along on the trip. The atmosphere is already grim, but it's not long before mysterious things start to happen and Mathias receives a message saying that Malin is in danger.

There turn out to be creatures living in the forest that are invisible to humans, unless they do what Mathias does: go through an uprooted tree and come out on the other side into a place where there are pixies and elves and a river sprite on the lookout for human food.

Mathias faces enormous trials and the trip proves to be anything but boring.





Kristian Hammerstad has produced illustrated portraits of all the interviewees.





HEROES OF DIVORCE


This book is written for anyone who has been through their parents' separation or knows someone else who has.

Emma's parents have just separated and are doing a trial run of their new life, while Ingrid has a stepfather who is unkind to her.

The book uses stories about children from different socio-economic, family, ethnic and cultural backgrounds. The aim is for this book to be relatable for as many children as possible.
